ARROWPATH SHAWL

An asymmetrical shawl that uses increases and decreases to bend it's stripes which gradually grow wider. The shawl is started at one tip, then worked sideways until reaching it's targeted width. Then a lace pattern is introduced to gradually taper it back down to only a few stitches. The main colour should be a speckle or variegated yarn that contrasts highly from the secondary colour.

Gauge

18 sts and 24 rows = 4'' in St. st

Measurements

64" (162.5 cm) long x 15.25" (38.5 cm) tall

Materials

Leizu DK by Julie Asselin

90% Superwash Merino Wool, 10% Silk 115g (4.06oz) = 238m (260y)

2 Skeins, sample shown in MC: Folk and CC: Week-End

Needles

5.0mm (US8) 32" or longer circular needles

Notions

2 Ring style stitch markers1 Locking marker, or safety pin

Abbreviations

Bef.	Before	M1P	Make one purl; with left needle, pick up bar

ARROWPATH SHAWL

Instructions

Using long tail method and CC, cast on 3 sts. Next Row: K1, P1, K1.

NOTE: In the upcoming rows of the pattern, the work contains 2 row stripes. Do not cut the yarns every two rows, but instead carry them up the side of the work. In order to create a neater edge, always bring the new yarn up to the right of the one just used.

Setup Rows

R1 (CC): K1, M1R, K1, M1L, K1 (5 sts)

R2 (CC): K2, P1, K2

R3 (CC): K2, M1R, K1, M1L, K2 (7 sts)

R4 (CC): K3, P1, K3

R5 (MC): K2, Pm, M1R, K3, M1L, Pm, K2 (9 sts)

R6 (MC): K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2. Attach CC.

R7 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, K1, Cdd, K1, M1L, Sm, K2 (9 sts)

R8 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, K2, P1, using locking marker to mark this purl st, K2, M1L, Sm, K2 (11 sts)

NOTE: The stitch that has just been marked with the locking marker is the central stitch. While working the next section, it is helpful to move the marker upwards closer to the needles often. If the pattern is describing this marker, it will refer to marked st; otherwise assume all markers are the ring markers on the needles.

Two Row Stripes

R1 (MC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2

R2 (MC): K2, Sm, M1P, purl to m, Sm, K2 (1 st inc)

Leave MC attached. Attach CC.

R3 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2

R4 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to marked st, P1, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2 (2 sts inc) (14 sts)

Repeat Two Row Stripes, **eleven** more times. (47 sts) Cut CC.

Six Row Stripes

R5 (MC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2

R6 (MC): K2, Sm, M1P, purl to m, Sm, K2 (1 st inc)

R7 (MC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to marker, M1L, Sm, K2

R8 (MC): K2, Sm, M1P, purl to m, M1P, Sm, K2 (2 sts inc)

Repeat R5-R6 once more.

Leave MC attached. Attach CC.

R9 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to marker, M1L, Sm, K2

R10 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to marked st, P1, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2 (2 sts inc)

Cut CC. (53 sts)

Repeat Six Row Stripes, six more times. (89 sts)

There will now be two border stitches at each edge, 29 stitches to the right of the marked center stitch and 55 stitches to the left of the marked center stitch.

Eight Row Stripes

R11 (MC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L, Sm, K2

R12 (MC): K2, Sm, purl to marker, Sm, K2

Repeat R11-R12, **three** more times. Leave MC attached. Attach CC. R13 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L. Sm, K2

R14 (CC): K2, Sm, knit to marked st, P1, knit to m, Sm, K2.

Cut CC

Repeat Eight Row Stripes, four more times.

Twelve Row Stripes

R15 (MC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L, Sm. K2

R16 (MC): K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

Repeat R15-R16, **five** more times. Leave MC attached. Attach CC. R17 (CC): K2, Sm, M1R, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, M1L. Sm, K2

R18 (CC): K2, Sm, knit to marked st, P1, knit to m, Sm, K2 Cut CC.

Repeat Twelve Row Stripes, two more times.

Do **NOT** cut CC.

Cut MC.

Lace Edging

Using CC:

R1: K2, Sm, knit to one st bef. marked st, Cdd, knit to m, Sm, K2 (2 sts dec)

R2: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2 (87 sts)

R3: K2, Sm, K1, (Yo, SSK) to one st before marked st, Cdd, (K2tog, Yo) to st before m, K1, Sm, K2 (85 sts)

R4: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

R5: K2, Sm, (Yo, SSK) to one st before marked st, Cdd, (K2tog, Yo) to m, Sm, K2 (83 sts)

R6: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

Repeat R3-R6, twelve more times. (35 sts)

R7: K2, Sm, K1, Cdd, (K2tog, Yo) to st bef. m, K1, Sm, K2 (33 sts)

R8: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

R9: K2, Sm, Cdd, (K2tog, Yo) to m, Sm, K2 (31 sts)

R10: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

R11: K2, Sm, SSK, (K2tog, Yo) to st bef. m, K1, Sm, K2 (30 sts)

R12: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2

R13: K2, Sm, SSK, (K2tog, Yo) to m, Sm, K2 (29 sts)

R14: K2, Sm, purl to m, Sm, K2 Repeat R11-R14 until 7 sts remain.

R15: K2, Rm, SSK, K1, Rm, K2 (6 sts)

R16: K2, P2, K2

R17: K2, SSK, K2 (5 sts)

R18: K2, P1, K2

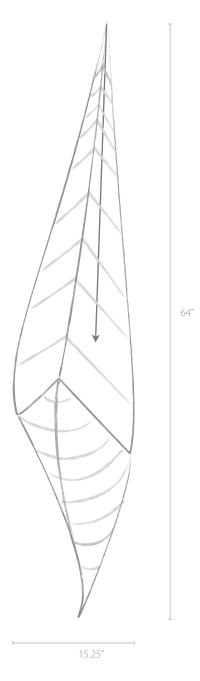
R19: K1, Cdd, K1 (3 sts)

R20: knit R21: Cdd (1 st)

Cut yarn leaving a 5" tail and pull through remaining stitch.

Finishing

Weave in all ends and wet block to finished dimensions.
